In today's Gospel, Jesus presents himself as the Good Shepherd, who has come that we might have "abundant life". The Good Shepherd issues to each of us an invitation to find our home in the Father's **love**, to experience the **joy** God desires for each of us, to embrace God's call to **friendship** with one another, and to discover the **fruitfulness** that comes from a living relationship with God in Jesus.

Each one of us has received a special calling from God, a personal vocation. We often think of that in terms of a job to do, a task to accomplish, or a state of life to which we commit ourselves. But more fundamentally, it is a call to **abundant life**: we find our vocation at "that place where our deep gladness intersects with the deep needs of the world around us." Last week, at our final Faith-CAFÉ of the season, Theresa Murphy gave us some tools to help us access this gift of abundant life which lies deep within us, and to address the obstacles and patterns of negativity that get in the way of our living our true vocations. It was a beautiful experience of being gently empowered to confront our fears and embrace our invitation to "abundant life".

How is God finding his way into **your** heart? How are you living his call to abundant life? After a long winter, we rejoice in the coming of spring: reminded of God who is the source of life and beauty, at work in and through his creation. We so easily take all this for granted. We are also called to carve out quiet space to meditate on God's word, to thank him for our daily blessings, to ask for strength in our daily needs: to remain connected to Jesus, drawing life from the vine.

One unique and precious way in which Jesus' invitation to abundant life is realized in us comes in the gift of the Eucharist. Let us pray today for the 24 children of our parish who are celebrating this weekend their **First Holy Communion**. May they experience abundant life in the Eucharist, Jesus' true and living presence in the world. May God bless their families, their catechists, and all those who have prepared them for this special encounter with Jesus. And may Mary, Mother of Jesus and source of inspiration for all mothers, watch over them and guide them. **Happy Mothers' Day!**
