# "Lazarus Unbound": God Desires to Set Us Free

Jesus shows a lot of emotion in today's gospel. He is disturbed and troubled; he is sad, and weeps over his friend Lazarus; he gets upset again. Death has that effect on most of us. Death is shocking. Death makes us angry and sad. It seems to have the power to bind us – like Lazarus constricted within his shroud, like Martha and Mary bound up in their grief. Whether death comes suddenly – or after a long, lingering illness – it always leaves us reeling.

And yet, Jesus is right there. He does not always come when we want him, or expect him. Like Mary, we are tempted to say, "Lord, where were you when we needed you?" In today's Gospel, Jesus raises Lazarus from the tomb. But eventually, Lazarus would again grow old, and die. The full gift of Resurrection comes only after Jesus himself rises from the tomb, triumphant over death itself. He is indeed "the Resurrection and the Life", and his rising, we too rise to everlasting life." The same question Jesus asks Martha in the Gospel, he asks of us: **"Do you believe this?"** 

**Do** we believe this? The answer we give is vital. For every human being ponders the question of why we have to die. We seek answers in religion, philosophy, mythology, or science. However many books are written on the subject, there is no simple answer. When faced with the sadness and confusion of death, we need to reframe the "why" question. Instead of asking "why must we die," start with "Why was I born? Why did God make me?" Then the answer is simple: "God made me to know, love, and serve him in this world, and to be happy with him forever in the next."

When we know this not just as the answer to a catechism question, but from a deep place within our heart, then death is no longer something to be feared. We can "welcome death as a friend." For death does not have the final word. What we welcome is the promise of peace that follows death: the promise of eternal life. Jesus wants to give us this life – in heaven, but also right here on earth. He wants to set us free from all that binds us: our fear, complacency, and brokenness: so come and celebrate his love and forgiveness in our Lenten reconciliation service this Thursday at 7.30 PM!!

Development and Peace has put in place a "cash-forward" project which allows small-scale farming communities to build terraced embankments that help fight soil erosion. The rain water that is collected in the brief rainy season is used to irrigate seedling nurseries to ensure food security and generate income. Farmers have also received drought resistance seeds and training session to improve their cultivation techniques.
