#### **REASONS TO HOPE**

In today's second reading, the Apostle Peter challenges the Christians of the first century to always "be ready to give an account for the hope that is in you": not defensively or aggressively, but with "gentleness and reverence". Jesus' own disciples were sad at the thought of his leaving, but he promised to send the "Paraclete": the Advocate, the Spirit of Truth, the living pledge of God's promise to never abandon his church. That promise holds true. As a church, our reason for hope is not our bank balance or the number of cathedral-size buildings we manage to keep open, but in the strength of our parish communities and the fidelity of our witness to the Gospel of hope.

Jesus invites us to refocus on our highest ideals – faith, hope, and love – and on our primary task of communicating the Gospel with courage and conviction. We must look for the signs of hope – those places where the church is growing, where parish life is vibrant, where outreach to the larger community is happening – rather than let ourselves be dragged down by the "doom and gloom" scenario of collapsing infrastructure and declining social influence.

At the report he gave following his recent pastoral visit, Bishop Dowd shared the following observations with us:

- Saint Monica's is a viable parish, expressing the Kingdom of God in its part of the diocese. There is genuine Christian community in this area. Liturgical life is vibrant. Key pastoral services are being offered. There is potential for growth.
- The parish is on a solid foundation to build for the future. Questions regarding the building will need to be addressed. Outreach activities, especially communications and welcome, can be strengthened even further. I believe that this parish can become a model of good stewardship.
- I am convinced that the Holy Spirit wants each parish to be a vibrant expression of the Kingdom of God. It has been a pleasure to discover how Saint Monica parish is living the Kingdom.

Then, Bishop Tom challenged us with a question: "What is our dream for the next 5 years?" Part of that dream involves reflecting on the quality of our stewardship, the way in which we make use of the time, talent, and treasure the Lord has entrusted to us for the building up of his Kingdom. As Bishop Tom mentioned, we are currently facing some issues regarding our physical infrastructure, the repair and maintenance of our physical plant. We want to ensure a clean, safe, attractive, and welcoming environment in which to carry on the work God wants us to do. Please join us downstairs after the 11 a.m. Mass this Sunday for the presentation of the parish financial report and an open discussion about this necessary dimension of the work of the New Evangelization Pope Francis has invited us to embrace.
