THE MARGUERITE BOURGEOYS MUSEUM

was founded in 1998 and celebrates its 20th Anniversary. A new guided tour will introduce tourists and other visitors to the heritage treasures and architectural charms of the Bonsecours neighbourhood.

Until May 1, the Marguerite Bourgeoys Museum and the Notre-Dame-de-Bon-Secours Chapel (400 St. Paul St. East, Montreal) will be open from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. Tuesday to Sunday.

Coup de Theatre/Founded Montreal! looks at the city's historical artifacts and special illustrations, the exhibition gives visitors a better idea of the complexity of founding the colony. It uses a theatrical approach and a cast of historical characters who contributed in some way to the birth of Montreal.

Guided tours of the Bonsecours neighbourhood from April 14 to June 9: learn about its historic buildings and public squares and of course the story of the colonists who made their homes in Ville-Marie's first faubourg.
