# CELEBRATING THE COMMUNION OF SAINTS: ALL SAINTS' AND ALL SOULS' DAY

In the Catholic liturgical calendar, **November 1st and 2nd** are two deeply significant days: **All Saints' Day** and **All Souls' Day**. Though they are separate observances, the Church places them side by side to remind us of the full

communion of the Church—those in Heaven, those being purified, and those still on earth. These days reflect the Church's teaching on the **Communion of Saints** and the eternal destiny of the human soul.

All Saints' Day, celebrated on November 1st, is Solemnity, one of the highest feast days in the Church. On this day, we honor all the saints—not just those officially canonized, but also the countless unknown saints who now share in the glory of Heaven. The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC 2683) teaches that saints are "the witnesses who have preceded us into the kingdom... they continue to participate in the salvation of the world." These holy men and women lived faithful lives and now enjoy the beatific vision—seeing God face to face. They are our models and our intercessors. This day reminds us of our calling to holiness and that sanctity is possible for everyone, not just a few.

All Souls' Day, on November 2nd, follows immediately to emphasize another aspect of the Church's faith: prayer for the dead. This is the day we remember and pray for all the faithful departed who are still undergoing purification in Purgatory before entering Heaven. The Church bases this practice on Scripture and Tradition. In 2 Maccabees 12:46, it says, "It is a holy and wholesome thought to pray for the dead." The Catechism (CCC 1030–1032) affirms that those who die in God's grace, but still need purification, benefit from our prayers and sacrifices. By praying for them—especially through the Holy Mass—we assist them on their journey to eternal life.

The Church places these days together to show the unity of the Church Triumphant (saints in Heaven), the Church Suffering (souls in Purgatory), and the Church Militant (us on earth). This reflects the depth of our faith: that death does not separate us from one another in Christ. We are united in love, prayer, and hope.

Together, these feasts call us to look beyond this life. All Saints' Day shows us our goal: Heaven. All Souls' Day reminds us of our responsibility to love and assist those still being purified. It is a beautiful expression of the mercy and justice of God, and the deep bond of love that ties the Church together across time and eternity.

To make these celebrations more **personal**, **meaningful**, **and spiritually nourishing**, I warmly invite you all to join us for the special Masses offered on these days.

We will celebrate All Saints' Day on Saturday, November 1st, at 8:30 AM Mass, commemorating this solemn feast with reverence and joy.

As November 2nd falls on a Sunday this year, we will observe All Souls' Day at all three Sunday Masses. As in previous years, to make this day more personal and heartfelt, we invite you to bring a photograph of your departed loved ones and place it on the designated table in front of the altar before Mass begins. To avoid any last-minute rush, please arrive early and have the photo ready.

Our volunteers will assist you in <u>lighting a candle in their memory</u>. We encourage you to invite your family and friends to join us for these special occasions. Please remember to **take the photograph home** with you after Mass.

Let us come together in prayer and love, honoring the saints and lifting the souls of our faithful departed, as one family in Christ.

As in previous years, our **Book of the Names of the Dead** is placed at the back of the church. We invite you to **inscribe the names of your deceased loved ones** whom you wish to be remembered in prayer during the month of **November**. If a name has already been entered in previous years, there is **no need to repeat it**. Throughout the entire month, we will **faithfully remember and pray for all the souls listed** in this book during our Masses and community prayers.
